**LOCAL STUDENTS JOIN MILLIONS IN CELEBRATING  
GLOBAL YOUTH SERVICE DAY**  
Annual day is largest service event in the world

AUSTIN, TX – Only a few days after President Obama signed the Edward M. Kennedy Serve America Act into law, ushering in a new era of service in a time of great need, local nonprofit College Forward will celebrate the spirit of service with three community events. The College Forward program is based on a model of service: full-time AmeriCorps volunteers coach low-income students through the college application process. In return for the free services they receive, College Forward students “pay it forward” by planning projects to help their communities.

This Saturday’s projects honor Global Youth Service Day, the largest service event in the world, which millions of youth worldwide participate in each year.

College Forward students have planned the following events:

**OUTDOOR CLASSROOM AT BATY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**

College Forward’s Student Leadership Council at Del Valle High School will help plan and implement the first-ever outdoor classroom at Baty Elementary School. The project will affect over 600 students and staff and will enhance science education at the elementary school. The outdoor classroom project is also intended to improve the Del Valle school district’s community pride as teens organize to improve education for their younger peers. Students will recruit thirty volunteers to help build the classroom, and will work alongside the elementary school teachers and students who will benefit from it. The project will take place on **Saturday, April 25 from 11 am to 2 pm at Baty Elementary, 2108 Faro Dr., Austin.**

**“THE SOUTHWOOD PARK THING” NEIGHBORHOOD FESTIVAL**

College Forward’s Student Leadership Council at Crockett High School will partner with the Southwood Park Neighborhood Association to put on “The Southwood Park Thing,” a neighborhood festival to foster community engagement. The Student Leadership Council will engage other student volunteers and work alongside neighborhood associates. The festival will take place on **Saturday, April 25, from 10 am to 2 pm at Southwood Park, 5120 South 1<sup>st</sup> St., Austin.**
